- The Executive Director shall make the Resolutions available to the Executive Committee at least two weeks in advance of the Annual Meeting.
- Resolutions must be accompanied by appropriate supporting documentation.

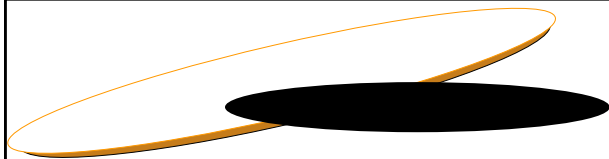
**Resolutions will be received at the CHAS Office up to September 28, 2015.**

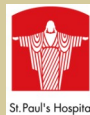
