Resolutions will be received at the CHAS Office up to October 3, 2008.

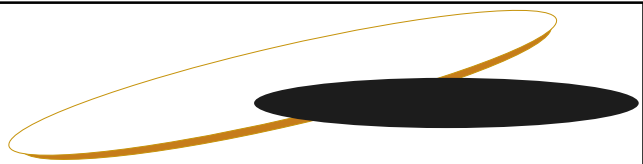
Resolutions Proposed at the Annual Meeting
