- The Executive Director shall make the Resolutions available to the Executive Committee at least two weeks in advance of the Annual Meeting.
- Resolutions must be accompanied by appropriate supporting documentation.

Resolutions Proposed at the Annual Meeting:

1. Resolutions intended to be proposed at the Annual Meeting, shall be submitted in writing with supporting documentation to the President at least 24 hours in advance of the scheduled time for the meeting.
2. Resolutions not submitted in accordance with No. 1 will be considered at the Annual Meeting only with the authorization of the President.

Professor Margaret Somerville was the founding director of the McGill Centre for Medicine, Ethics and Law. She plays an active role in the development of applied ethics, in particular, the study of wider ethical and legal aspects of medicine and science. She is the author of "*The Ethical Canary: Science, Society, and the Human Spirit*" (2000), and "*Death Talk: the Case Against Euthanasia and Physician-Assisted Suicide*" (2001). She presented the 2006 CBC Massey Lectures, which were published as a book under the title "*The Ethical Imagination: Journeys of the Human Spirit*" (House of Anansi Press, 2006).



Professor Somerville has earned numerous distinctions. She is the recipient of the Order of Australia 1990 and she was elected a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada in 1991. In 2004 she was named the first recipient of the UNESCO Avicenna Prize for Ethics in Science. She is the recipient of numerous honorary doctorates and honours.
