Education Focus

KEYNOTE ADDRESS FR. TONY RICARD



Rev. R. Tony Ricard, M.Th., M.Div., is a Priest for the Archdiocese of New Orleans and is Campus Minister and Theology Teacher at St. Augustine High School in New Orleans. He is a Core Instructor of Church Doctrine for the Institute for Black Catholic Studies at Xavier University in New Orleans. Fr. Tony has given keynote addresses, retreats, revivals and youth talks across the USA. At last count, he has preached in 20 countries. Fr. Tony is native of New Orleans.

"If Loving You is Wrong, I Don't Want to be Right! Exploring God's Unconditional Love"

Some have come to believe that they are responsible for telling God whom to love. Rather than loving unconditionally, they choose to exclude folks from the embrace of our Heavenly Father. They choose to marginalize anyone who is not like them. Somehow the poor, the weak, the immigrant and even the gay communities are not deserving of God's love. This workshop will explore God's offer of love to those who are often cast aside by the self-righteous. With the eyes and heart of Jesus, we should all be saying, "If loving you is wrong, I don't want to be right!"

"Have You Seen Him?" Searching for the Child Jesus

In these Modern Times, it is easy for teachers and preachers to become distracted by the world around us. If we are not careful, we can lose site of what is truly essential to our common call as ministers to God's Beloved. Part of our ministerial task is to be on a constant search for the presence of the Christ Child in our world. Each day, we are given the chance to encounter the Lord. But, I wonder how many times has Jesus Christ tried to visit us and we missed seeing Him for who He really was. We are all called to search for Christ in the least expected places.

KEYNOTE ADDRESS DR. MATTHEW SLEETH



Matthew Sleeth, MD, is the author of *24/6: Prescription for a Healthier, Happier Life*. A former chief of staff and emergency room director, Dr. Sleeth left his practice to teach, preach, and write about a holistic approach to biblical stewardship. A highly sought after speaker, Dr. Sleeth has spoken at more than 1,000 churches, campuses, and events, including serving as the monthly guest preacher at The Washington National Cathedral. Dr. Sleeth is the executive director of Blessed Earth and founder of the Seminary Stewardship Alliance.

24/6: A Prescription for a Healthier, Happier Life

Remember the Sabbath and keep it holy. Sounds nice, but how do we find rest in a 24/7 world? Just as the Hebrews were slaves in Egypt, we have become slaves to technology. Our technological tools allow 24-hour productivity and connectivity, give us more control, and subtly enslave us to busyness itself. Sabbath is about restraint—intentionally not doing everything all the time just because we can. Setting aside a day of rest helps us reconnect with our Creator and find the peace of God that passes all understanding. The Sabbath is about letting go of the controls one day a week and letting God be God. So how do we do it?

In this session, Dr. Matthew Sleeth describes our symptoms, clarifies the signs, diagnoses the illness, and lays out a simple plan for living a healthier, more God-centered life in a digitally-dazed, always-on world. Sleeth shares how his own family was dramatically transformed when it adopted Sabbath practices and will help us better understand how our own lives can be transformed—physically, emotionally, relationally and spiritually—by adopting the 24/6 lifestyle.
