Every spring, CHAS sponsors educational sessions relating to issues in Catholic health care around mission, spiritual care or ethics.

This year we'd like to introduce a *critical conversation* regarding *euthanasia*. As a Catholic organization, our position is to always support a culture of life, from conception to its natural end. However, the euthanasia question is becoming more prominent in health care circles, legislature, and main stream media - and the faith community is looking to respond.

As long time supporters and advocates of *palliative care*, it is our pleasure to bring *Jeff Christiansen*, *Executive Director of Regina Palliative Care Inc.*, to the podium. Jeff is an articulate and engaging speaker, who understands the pastoral and spiritual dimensions of supporting the needs of individuals and families at the end of life.

This session is not intended to be a clinical presentation on palliative medicine or an in-depth ethical discourse. Rather, it is an *invitation to the Catholic*, *Christian and faith-filled community to understand the issues that surround end of life, and be encouraged to embrace a culture of life and hope throughout the entire journey.* Beyond the medical and ethical dilemmas that often surround the end of life, exists a **critical conversation** that is often overlooked. How do we as a Christian or faith-filled community **approach and respond to death** as individuals, families and communities? How do we **journey with those who fear** they may become a burden on others, are depressed or stressed from their illness, or fear the pain associated with terminal illnesses?



Jeff Christiansen, Executive Director of Regina Palliative Care Inc., will explore the theological, pastoral, and spiritual dimensions of responding to the needs of individuals and families at the end of life and will highlight the importance of

a palliative care approach.
