

## Guidelines and Information for Scholarship

Scholarship funds are made available to persons who have registered or are planning to register in a Palliative Care home study or certificate program.

Grants are made for programs which have a direct application to palliative care.

Funds are designated for tuition and texts associated with the specified program.

Requests are not considered on a continuing or ongoing basis.

The fund is administered by a Committee of the Board of Directors. Ordinarily funds will be allocated on an annual basis.

The number of scholarships awarded in any year is based on the approved criteria and in relation to available funds.

Submission should be made in writing to the Fund by using the **Scholarship Application Form** provided. Please include any other pertinent material the applicant feels will help in the evaluation of the application.

The applicant will be advised in writing of the decision of the committee.

**Applications received up to June 30 will be considered in the current year.**

### History

The Moola-Freer Scholarship and Award was established in 1995 with the objective of furthering the advancement of palliative care education and recognizing persons who show excellence in the field of palliative care.

The fund was established by Dr. Dawood Moola and wife Anne in the name of their parents.

Dr. and Mrs. Dawood Moola strongly support the 'life-affirming' philosophy and values offered by health care professionals to individuals and families in the area of palliative care.

Through the establishment of the scholarship and the award, it is hoped that more opportunities for education will be made available and that excellence in the provision of palliative care services will be recognized.

### The Award

Honoring those who serve with compassion in palliative care, the award features a butterfly which celebrates the beauty of a life lived, and brings hope for new life.

It is presented annually at the banquet of the Catholic Health Association Annual Convention in late October.
